- 7 cases involved vehicles
- 1 case involved an apartment and 5 residences
- 1 case involved a residence with a known suspect
 - The suspect who was a former Livingston resident who now lives in Atwater was caught committing **another** burglary. An arrest warrant had been issued for his arrest.

- 2 cases involved commercial restaurant burglaries. Good evidence was gathered and the suspect has committed similar crimes throughout the San Joaquin Valley. The information/video was provided to media. The suspect is now in custody, great work and follow up by Sgt Ramirez.

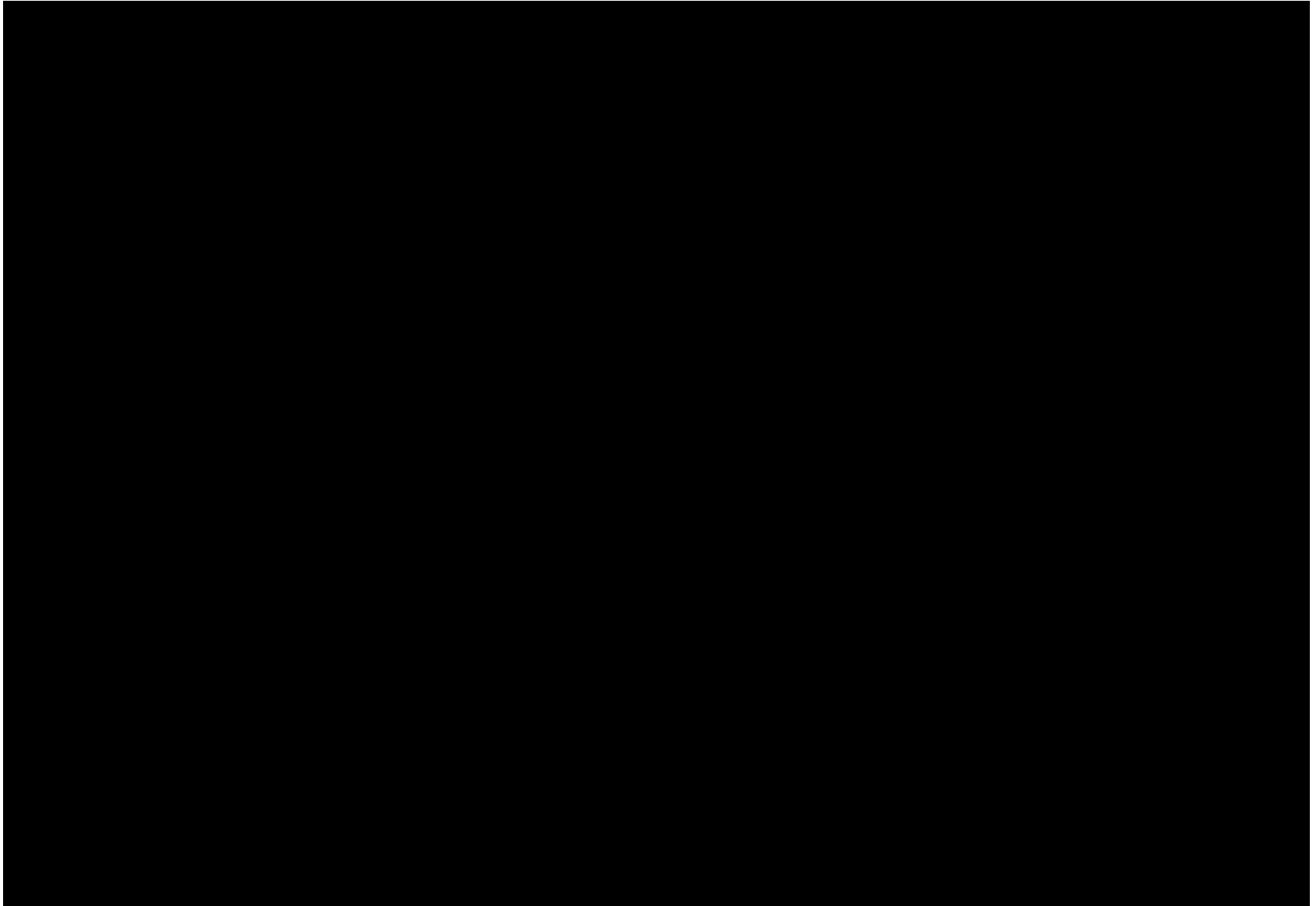

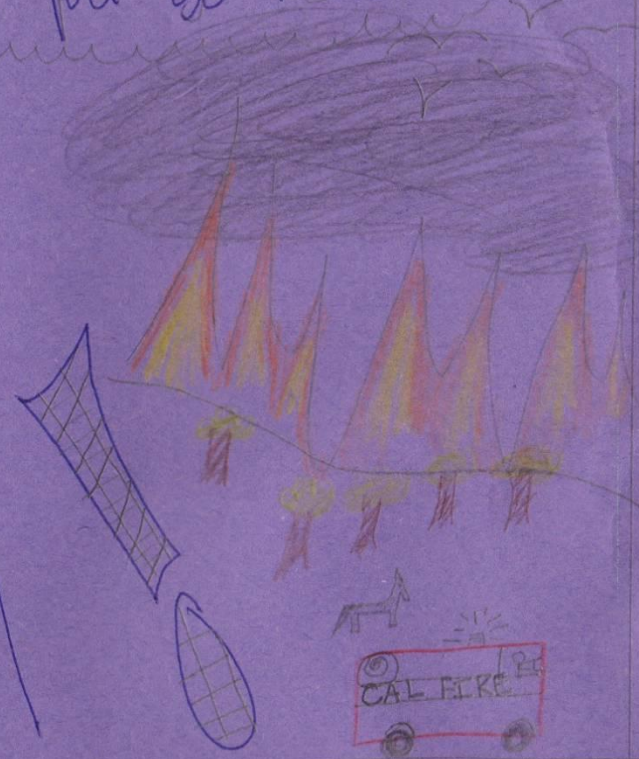

- Remember- If it sounds too good to be true-It probably is!



Halloween Safety

H Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you. Make sure you walk and not run from house to house.

A Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.

L Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks.

L Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.

O Only walk on sidewalks. If not possible, walk along the far edge of the road facing traffic.

W Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.

E Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.

E Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Don't stop at dark houses. Never accept rides from strangers.

N Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame resistant costumes.



Watchguard Body Worn / Dash Camera Policies

- Lexipol Policy Sections 447 & 450
- All recordings property of Police Department
- When Cameras Activated
 - All enforcement and Investigative Contacts
 - Traffic Stops
 - Self-Initiated Activity
 - Any situation that becomes adversarial
- Sensitive to Dignity of individuals-sensitive to privacy
- May surreptitiously record



Watchguard Body / Worn Dash Camera Policies

- Do not record around reported explosive device
- Prohibited Use
 - Personal Use
 - Personal Recorders
 - To Embarrass, Intimidate, or Ridicule
- Retention Policy: minimum 180 days-Longer if required in court
- Reviewed:
 - Preparing Report
 - With supervisor approval
 - Court Order
 - By Media with Chief of Police Permission
 - If Permitted – Compliance with Public Records Requests
