Burglary Action Plan Status Report

2012/13 Statistics

January	25/1 (To Date)	May	11	September	2
February	14	June	11	October	4
March	18	July	6	November	3
April	14	August	3	December	9

(Includes vehicle, commercial, and residential burglaries)

- Year end total = 120 compared with 180 in 2011 year end
- When comparing 2012 with 2011, burglaries have been reduced 40%
- Officers have arrested 16 subjects for burglary since the Plan was implemented in May 2012. Burglaries have been reduced 80% since that time.



Realignment and Proposition 36 and its impact on local law enforcement


- AB 109/AB 117
- Signed into law April 5, 2011
- Local custody for non-violent, nonserious, non-sex offenders
- Changes to State Parole
- Local post release supervision/14,000
- Merced County Executive Committee
- Community Corrections Partnership
- Revise definition of Felony
- Alternative Custody Tools
- Can contract back to Prisons
- NO State Prison Inmates to local jails
- All 58 Counties have Probation Dept. overseeing program

- Proposition 36
- Passed by voters in 2012
- Original 3 Strikes law passed in 1994
- Known as 3 Strikes Reform Act
- Modifies 3 strikes law to impose life sentence only when 3rd strike is serious or violent or involved a firearm
- Allows 3,000 of the 9,000 inmates currently servicing life sentences to appeal for early release (post facto)
- Will be released to local jurisdictions
