

- Reviewing and Updating Animal Control Ordinances and Resolutions
- Encouraging Responsible Pet Ownership
- Looked at Best Practices in other jurisdictions
- Currently Providing a service, in general, not recovering all associated fees
- Will bring Resolution to Council in near future

- Encourages Pet neutering to reduce overpopulation

Licensing Fees Recommendations

- Altered Dogs
 - ☐ Annual License \$10
 - □ Two Year License \$15
 - □ Three Year License \$20
- Unaltered Dogs
 - □ Annual License \$150
 - ☐ Two Year License \$300
 - ☐ Three Year License \$450

Administrative Citations

- The Administrative Citation is a civil option available
- Allows Officers to issue a non-criminal citation
- Utilized for applicable animal control violations
- The fine schedule would be:
 - □ First Violation < \$100</p>
 - ☐ Second Violation < \$200
 - □ Third Violation < \$500</p>
- All Fees retained by City as opposed to Criminal Citations
