May 21 to June 3

- Statewide traffic safety campaign
- According to statistics, 61% of those killed in accidents were not buckled up
- Younger motorists and men are highest at risk
- Goal is to increase seatbelt use which is currently at 96.2%
- Fines range from \$142 to \$445
- Emphasis will be on issuance of citations with zero tolerance

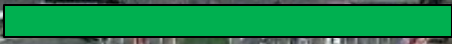
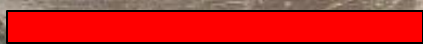

- We have received a lot of good information which resulted in the arrest of subject who stole a bicycle, information on a stolen truck in a neighborhood and a description of a burglar we are looking for
- We have visited all schools (except LHS) giving presentations to children about personal safety
- To date, the LPD has arrested 6 subjects for burglary
