

Marijuana Ordinance Staff Direction



- Livingston Police Model patterned after Fresno Model
- Prohibit marijuana from being grown outdoors
- Must be grown in fully enclosed structure with lockable doors
- Less access to our youth
- Decrease in violence associated with known Marijuana grows

- Merced County's Marijuana Regulation Ordinance
- Passed September 10, 2013
- Sets Parcel Cultivation Limits to 12 plants maximum
- Annual yield of 12 pounds
- 10,896 cigarettes per day
- 30 per day per patient
- 12 pounds = \$36,000
- 3 crop rotation = over \$72,000
